Today(October 18th) was the last day in which the participants could prove that they deserve the 1st place in this year's RMS. All of the participants that we talked to were sure that they had a chance to be among the best three teams since most of them are already accustomed to winning prizes. Regardless of their winning or not, the teams said they would attend the farewell party organized for them tonight.



We interviewed some of the foreign contestants and they told us they were very grateful for a chance to visit Romania.
