TOPIC: SOLVING MYSTERIES AND RIDDLES AGE GROUP: 14-15 YEARS OLD/ 8 GRADE

TIME: 45 MINUTES

AIMS:

Skills development:

- > to develop students' speaking skills talking about mysteries, discussing the riddles
- > to develop students' reading skills and scanning and skimming skill reading the story
- > to develop students' writing skills write the ending for the story
- > to develop students' creative thinking

Pedagogical aims:

- > to arise students' interest in the topic
- > to acquaint the students with new vocabulary
- > to give clear and comprehensible instructions for each activity
- > to develop students' team spirit

Activities:

Number of Activity	Name of activity	Description of activity	Time
1	Lead in - Discussion	Do you like mysteries? Why/ why not? Tell me a riddle in English. Students share the riddles they know with the class.	5 min
2	Solving a mystery	-The teacher gives the students a short text, which contains some mystery in it. The text does not include the ending, the solution of the mystery. The text should be read in class, the unknown words, which are essential to the whole understanding of the text, are explained and taught. -The students are divided in pairs. Each pair has to think of an ending for the story. The students write the ending and then each pair shares their ending with the class. Then the teacher tells the students the real ending of the story.	20 min
3	Interactive activity – <u>Riddles</u>	"Let's continue with the mysteries theme. I have some riddles for you." The class is now divided into groups of 4-5 students, riddles are presented to the class one by one. Each group has to discuss the riddle in English and then the first group to find out what the answer is gets 1 point. If the riddle is too difficult for the students, the teacher gives hints. The winning group receives some present- something little, connected with the topic.	20 min

Each letter has three parts. Students click on one of these parts. When they click, a riddle appears and a box to write the answer. There is a HELP button, too. If the students type the correct answer, they can choose another riddle- the students don't have to answer all the riddles and they may

choose any part. If the answer is wrong the students may try again or use the HELP button.

After each correct answer "WELLDONE! Choose another riddle." appears.

In the brackets are explanations, the students have to write only the answers. The Answers and explanations appear when the HELP button is pressed.
